# 86 TRANSPORT VIETNAM ASSOCIATION INCORPORATED 7<sup>TH</sup> NATIONAL REUNION REPORT 30 APRIL 2015



Report from the 2014 Reunion Committee on the 7<sup>th</sup> National Reunion held in Victor Harbor from 22 to 26 April 2014

#### Context of the 2014 Reunion

86 Transport Platoon was raised in Bandiana in 1960 under the command of Headquarters 1 Company RAASC. The first OC of the Platoon was Second Lieutenant Ron Kelly who held the post from 6 February 1960 to 24 May 1961.

Just 7 years later Detachment 86 Transport Platoon under the command of Second Lieutenant John Hoare was deployed to Vietnam on 22 April 1967. In early 1968, 86 became a full strength Platoon and remained in Vietnam until the closing of 1 ALSG on 29 February 1972. When 1ALSG closed and the last elements of 86 Transport Platoon in Vietnam embarked on the HMAS Sydney on the same day a total of 468 men had served in either Detachment 86 Transport Platoon or 86 Transport Platoon in Vietnam.

26 years later in 1998 a small group of former platoon members living in South Australia started to meet to organise the first National Reunion of former members of 86 Transport Platoon RAASC who served in Vietnam. The reunion was organised in Adelaide around Anzac Day 1999.

During the 1999 Reunion Committee Meeting in Adelaide on 21 September 1998, it was decided to form the 86 Transport Vietnam Association and seek incorporation under the South Australian Associations Incorporation Act 1985. The original committee members present at the meeting who formed the inaugural membership and sponsored the formation of the Association were Bill Denny, Bill Hignett, Rod Langman, Graham Bulger, Bill Moyle, Barry Field, Ian Milnes and Harry White.

A constitution was developed and approved at the meeting on 5 October 1998 and the office bearers elected at that meeting were President Bill Denny; Secretary, Bill Hignett; Minute Secretary Graham Bulger; Treasurer Bill Moyle; Public Officer, Bill Hignett; Committee members, Rod Langman and Barry Field.

Since that first reunion, a further 5 National Reunions have been organised under the 86 Transport Vietnam Association banner and our 7<sup>th</sup> National Reunion returned to South Australia and was held in Victor Harbor from 22 to 26 April 2014.

On 26 April 2012 the Association Committee met and established the 2014 Reunion Committee comprising Bill Denny, Bill Hignett, Ken Parker, Rudi Bos, Des Boyce, Denis Hicks, Brent Sweet, Harry White and Gary Zbierski as a sub-committee of the Association. The Committee also determined that the 2014 Reunion Committee would be delegated the responsibility of organising the 2014 reunion in Victor Harbor for Association members and their families around Anzac Day 2014 and authorized to open an account with an appropriate financial institution in order to manage the financial arrangements concerning the 2014 reunion.

The 86 logo which is on the front cover of this reunion report has been modernised but still retains the original elements of logo designed by Ken Parker when he was posted to 86 Transport Platoon in 1968.

#### Features of the Reunion

#### These included

- The introduction of the march in Victor Harbor on Anzac Day 2014 instead of veterans travelling to Adelaide for the first time in over 40 years.
- The Secretary of the Association being given the opportunity to give the Anzac Day address to the Victor Harbor community explaining 86 Transport Platoon's involvement in Vietnam.
- The special and moving memorial cross tribute at the Anzac Day ceremony to 86 Transport Platoon members who served in Vietnam but had passed away.
- 238 participants in the 2014 reunion, mainly accommodated in the one caravan park.
- The re-establishment of the Turtle Tavern.
- The Turtle Tavern being used as a focal point for gatherings.
- Our partners being issued with 86 scarves for the reunion.
- The generous \$5,160 donated by those attending the reunion to assist with the running of the reunion.
- Corporate and personal donations contributed to 6% of the costs incurred for running the 2014 Reunion.
- The seed funding of \$9,000 provided by the 2012 Reunion Committee after organising the very successful reunion in Nelson Bay.
- The 139 former members of 86 Transport Platoon and Detachment 86 Transport Platoon in Vietnam marching and participating under the 86 banner in the Victor Harbor March on Anzac Day 2014.
- The day trip on 22 April 2014 featuring the cockle train and paddle boat steamer.
- The exceptional amount of time and effort put in by Bill Denny, Bill Hignett, Ken Parker, Rudi Bos, Des Boyce, Denis Hicks, Brent Sweet, Harry White and Gary Zbierski to attend meetings and organise the 2014 reunion in Victor Harbor.

In order to encourage early registrations, the 2014 Reunion Committee decided to enter all of the registrants who paid their registrations by 30 September 2013 into a raffle for a kindle. The kindle was funded by a donation from Gary and Tania Hackett.

A total of 220 people registered by this date and each person was allocated a number in the order of the date they registered. The winning number was 148 and this number was allocated to Gwen Johansen who was sent the kindle by post.

The success of this initiative is demonstrated by \$1,993.46 in interest being able to be used to assist with the reunion costs.

ABC TV in its 7.30 Report included a story on the reunion and the platoon's involvement and history in Vietnam. The presentation can be viewed on the Association's website


#### Statement by Ken Parker, Treasurer, 2014 Reunion Committee

#### Appendix A:

### 2014 ANZAC DAY ADDRESS – VICTOR HARBOR By Bill Hignett

You will have noticed at today's Anzac Day March the striking banner with the Cobra on it and the group of marchers behind it. The Cobra is the emblem for 86 Transport Platoon a platoon of truckies deployed to Vietnam from 1967 to 1972. The Platoon is conducting a reunion in Victor Harbor over this weekend and I have asked Bill Hignett to address us on 86 Transport Platoon's involvement in Vietnam. Bill was a school teacher when he was called up for National Service and served as a driver with 86 Transport Platoon in Vietnam from 7 October 1970 until 19 January 1972. He is also the Secretary of the Platoon's Association and Reunion Committee.

Distinguished guests, ladies and gentlemen, fellow 86ers and their families, boys and girls.

Our unit the 86 Transport Platoon Royal Australian Army Service Corps is currently conducting its Seventh Nation Reunion in this beautiful city of Victor Harbor and I have been asked in this address to focus on our Platoon's active service when it was based in Vietnam from 22<sup>nd</sup> April 1967 to 12<sup>th</sup> March 1972.

It is just over 47 years ago today when 30 young men in their early 20s left the Managalore Airport in Victoria and flew in a chartered Trans Australian Airlines jet to Darwin where they transferred to a RAAF Hercules Aircraft landing some time later the next day in Vung Tau Vietnam. 12 of these men who are now in their 70s are here at this service today.

This was a common experience for many of the Australian soldiers who were posted to Vietnam. Many travelled on commercial or RAAF aircrafts to Vung Tau or Saigon and then were ferried to their units.

However, most of the infantry battalions were ferried on the HMAS Sydney which was a troop ship from the Second World War.

Initially for our unit's first 12 months in Vietnam our platoon was a detachment but 8 months later the detachment numbers were increased to a platoon of 33 vehicles comprising 5 sections and 77 men including 2 Officers at the rank of Captain and Second Lieutenant.

Later our platoon strength was further increased so that it comprised sections of cargo trucks, sections of tippers, a section of buses, sections of semi trailers and a section of ice trucks and potable and non potable water trucks.

#### Our tasks included

- The resupply of the Task Force with daily convoys from Vung Tau to Nui Dat
- Tipper support to the Army Engineering Construction Squadron for the building of roads in Phouc Tuy Province South Vietnam
- Water supply tasks to both Nui Dat & Vung Tau bases
- Resupply convoys from Long Binh to Nui Dat and Vung Tau
- Transporting troops to operations in the field or returning from operations in the field
- Transporting Australian entertainers for troop concerts in Vietnam

- Port clearance of goods and supplies when the supply ships HMAS Jeparit and Sydney docked in Vietnam
- The insertion and extraction of equipment, fuel and ammunition from Australian fire support bases in Vietnam.
- Transporting the changeover of the infantry company based at the Horseshoe Fire support base
- Assisting the Civil Affairs Unit building housing and community projects for the Vietnamese.

All of these duties were carried out in soft shelled vehicles with little protection and many of the tasks were over dirt roads in Vietnam. Our main protection was our gun jeep at the front of the convoy which was a Landrover with an M60 machine gun mounted on it. All of our drivers also had an armed soldier riding shotgun alongside him.

In some instances the roads had been cleared by early morning choppers inspecting the safety of the roads before we travelled on them. In other instances we were sometimes protected by Armoured Personnel Carriers driving in our convoys or lining the side of the road when we travelled along it.

Besides our normal duties, we were also assigned like other soldiers on the base to assisting in the protection of our base by rostered nightly pickets on the perimeter wire.

For the time we were in Vietnam our tour of duty like most Australian soldiers in Vietnam, was approximately 12 months but the 86 Transport Platoon was based in Vietnam from 22 April 1967 until 12 March 1973 which is total of 4 years and 11 months. The platoon strength was maintained by reinforcements with continual replacements for the soldiers going home.

In the 4 years and 11 months the Platoon was based in Vietnam its vehicles travelled over 4 million miles and 465 soldiers served in the Platoon.

It was also the time of conscription and about half of men who served in the platoon in Vietnam were National Serviceman on their compulsory 2 years of Army Service. The remaining half was regular soldiers in the Australian Army. However, our bonds of friendship and comradeship remain strong and many of us still keep in contact even though our service in the platoon was over 45 years ago.

The 22 young men of 86 Transport Platoon who boarded the small landing craft to be ferried out along with their vehicles which formed the last operational convoy of the Royal Army Service Corps in Vietnam to the HMAS Sydney on 29 February 1972 were among the last Australian soldiers from the 1<sup>st</sup> Australian Logistics Support Group Base to leave Vietnam. They sailed back into Sydney Harbour on 12<sup>th</sup> March 1972. This marked the end of the platoon's involvement in the Vietnam War.

27 years later in 1999 the platoon which had been renamed 86 Transport Troop was in action again for 12 months as part of Australia's military commitment in East Timor. That is why East Timor has been added to our banner. We are all proud of our service in Vietnam and our contribution to Australia's military history.
