2018 also marks the 50th anniversary of our logo. In May 1968 Ken Parker was posted to 86 Transport Platoon in South Vietnam and saw the tyre with the 86 Tac Sign inside it in our transport yard. Prior to being called up for National Service Ken was a talented artist who had won art prizes at the Royal Adelaide Show and had successfully designed a logo for the Lions Club.

He knew how important logos were to branding and symbolising the strength of an organisation and designed the 86 logo of the cobra on wheels to demonstrate the strength of 86 Transport Platoon in Vietnam. He worked on the design over 3 or 4 nights and enlisted the support of Rocky Anock to replace the 86 tac sign inside the tyre with the new logo he had designed.
